# Education

#### Raza's 5 Pearls from the CGS Conference 2014

1. Timing Lasix 6 hours before bedtime will allow maximal diuresis before bed, thus heading to bed in relative volume depletion to minimize occurrences of nocturia

2. 1 year recurrence rate of seizures is 50% in those with dementia who have had a single seizure. Cholinesterase inhibitors increase seizure risk.

3. Domperidone can be used for GI motility in Parkinson's Disease but also can be used to improve autonomic symptoms due to peripheral dopamine blockade. QTc prolongation becomes a concern at doses above 40mg per day.

4. Novel anticoagulants ARE reversible with PCC (Rivaroxaban) or FEIBA (Dabigatran) and have significantly less intracranial bleeding than Warfarin. FEIBA = PCC + VIIa (can be mixed together if FEIBA not available in your hospital)

5. TAVI improves 2 year mortality from 50% to 30% vs. medical management (NNT 5)

#### Research



The **Toronto Dementia Research Alliance (TDRA)** is a strategic coalition of the University of Toronto Faculty of Medicine and the 5 university-affiliated memory clinics at Baycrest, CAMH, St. Michael's Hospital, Sunnybrook and UHN, established in 2009. The mission of the TDRA is to mitigate suffering from neurodegenerative disorders through research on disease mechanisms, targets for disease modification and methods of early diagnosis and treatment. The TDRA is now recruiting for its first two major research projects: the SARTAN-AD Trial and the BEAM Study.

The **SARTAN-AD Trial** is a 12-month randomized, open-label, head-to-head comparison study of an Angiotensin Receptor Blocker versus an ACE Inhibitor (perindopril), in patients age 55 and older with mild Alzheimer's Disease (MMSE 16-27) and mild-moderate hypertension. Ventricular expansion on brain MRI will be the main outcome, though other brain and neuro-behavioural measures will also be examined.

The **BEAM (Brain Eye Amyloid Memory)** Study is a cross-sectional investigation that will use an innovative optical device to look for the presence of beta amyloid in the lens of the eye in patients aged 55-90 with Mild Cognitive Impairment (MoCA  $\geq$ 18), Alzheimer's Disease, Lewy Body Dementia/ Parkinson's Disease Dementia, and Vascular Cognitive Impairment (MMSE  $\geq$ 20), as well as normal controls. The results of the eye test will be validated against cognitive testing, brain MRI, and amyloid PET imaging.
