Combined University Research Day (June)

This year's annual Combined University Research Day was hosted by Waterloo at the Centre of Excellence for Innovation in Aging. The event was structured to emphasize patient, family and interprofessional communication with the addition of two juries to complement the traditional scientifically-based judging: The Village of University Gates Jury (interprofessional practice award) and Residents and Families Jury (patient-centered care award).

It is noteworthy to mention that Annie's supervisor, Camilla, received the very same award 15 years prior when she was a medical student! Annie is funded by a Li Ka Shing Knowledge Institute scholarship, the aim of which is to provide initial support for self-sustainable research of exemplary students who are pursuing graduate degrees.





Reflections: Society for General Internal Medicine (SGIM) Meeting

This past May, **Dr. Jennifer Watt** attended the annual SGIM meeting in Hollywood, Florida; she was selected for an oral presentation, *Preoperative Risk Factors Predict Risk of Delirium and Other Postoperative Complications among Elderly Patients Undergoing Elective Surgery: Systematic Review.* Dr. Sharon Straus also attended, noting that the caliber of data generated interest amongst participants and that "the audience was surprised she was still a resident!".

Upon reflecting on her experience, Jennifer offered some key learnings:

<u>Covey's 4 quadrants</u> - try to designate time for the important, but not, urgent items (see right)

<u>Update on perioperative medicine</u>

Evidence continues to evolve for beta blocker use. Expert
opinion seems to favour starting beta blockers preoperatively
only in those patients at high risk of perioperative event ≥7
days in advance of surgery

- ACEi/ARB should be restarted early in the postoperative period (≤7 days postop); otherwise, patients at increased risk of 30 day mortality postoperatively.
- Preoperative statins appear to decrease the risk of major cardiovascular complications in the perioperative period

<u>PlanYourLifespan.org</u> - an interactive tool meant to help older adults engage in advanced care planning was tested in a multi-centre RCT and showed increased planning behaviours.

UPDATE: Residency Program Committee Key Messages



- On June 8th 2016, the residency program underwent a successful internal review. The faculty were recognized for their dedication to the educational program.
- Supervisors are reminded to review learning objectives with residents at the start of the rotation. Feedback should be provided both mid-rotation and at the end of the rotation. Mid-rotation feedback is valuable and enables trainees to focus their efforts and demonstrate improvement during a rotation.
- **NEW:** We are introducing the <u>Royal College Consultation Letter Rating Scale</u> (click blue hyperlinked text to download). This tool should be used to evaluate consultation letters at least once every 6 months in the longitudinal clinic and on each rotation.
